KCCB works on projects involving litter prevention and cleanup, community beautification, graffiti removal, waste reduction, and recycling.

The Youth Representative would serve as a full board member during the 2018-19 school year and would be eligible to serve a second year.

## Seeking applications for a **Youth Representative Board Position**

Entries must be postmarked by April 13, 2018, or emailed by 5 p.m. of that date

Keep Clark County Beautiful (KCCB) is seeking a youth representative to serve on its board of directors. The youth representative would be a voting member of the board, with all rights and responsibilities. The KCCB board meets 6 times a year. Board meetings are usually held at 11:30 a.m. on a Wednesday, at the Clark County Combined Health District office. Board members also are expected to participate in at least one subcommittee, which would meet 2-4 times a year at various times, and to volunteer for KCCB events as available. The youth representative's term would be from July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019.

KCCB is the local affiliate of Keep America Beautiful, the nation's largest volunteer-based community action and education organization. KAB focuses on litter prevention, waste reduction, and community beautification. KCCB's mission is to engage Clark County residents to take pride, ownership, and responsibility for enhancing their community's environment.

KCCB is governed by a board that includes elected officials, government workers, business people, and community leaders. The board's subcommittees work on graffiti, litter, beautification, education, and fundraising. KCCB's best-known program is the Great American Cleanup, a volunteer campaign to pick up litter and beautify public places from March 1 to May 31. In 2017, the Cleanup involved 1,426 volunteers, who picked up 645 bags of litter from more than 100 spots in Clark County.

The youth representative will be expected to:

- Attend and participate in board meetings.
- Serve on at least one subcommittee.
- Demonstrate passion for and involvement in issues around litter prevention, waste reduction, and community beautification.
- Attend a Clark County high school with a GPA of at least 3.0 (on a 4-point scale).

To be eligible for this position, candidates should submit the application and all required documents postmarked by **April 13, 2018**, to Steve Schlather, Keep Clark County Beautiful, 1602 West Main St., Springfield, OH 45504.
